Kiran Nagarkar is one of the significant voices in the fiction of contemporary South Asia. He is a bilingual writer whose first book in Marathi, *Saat Sakkam Trechalis* (Seven Sixes Are Forty Three) is credited to be one of the two novels that initiated the turn towards modern fiction in Marathi literature. He has written three other novels: *Ravan and Eddie*, *Cuckold* (which won the 2001 Sahitya Akademi Award in India), and *God's Little Soldier*, which depicts the process of radicalization in the youth of modern-day India.
